- More than 300,000 passengers in February 2022
- 68% of pre-COVID-19 levels
- All domestic routes reinstated from March, new routes added
- Singapore and New Zealand connections resumed

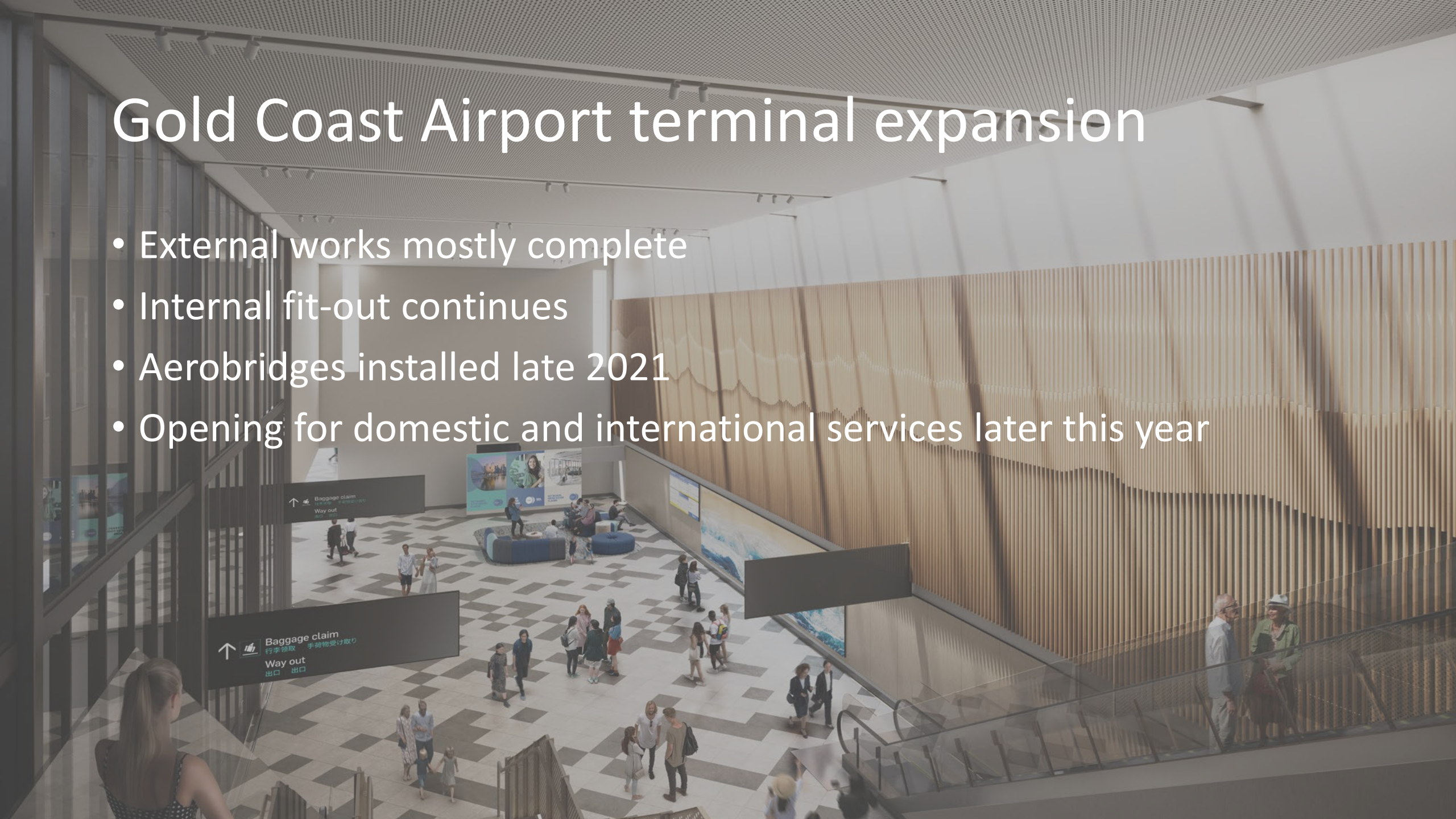
New and existing connections established

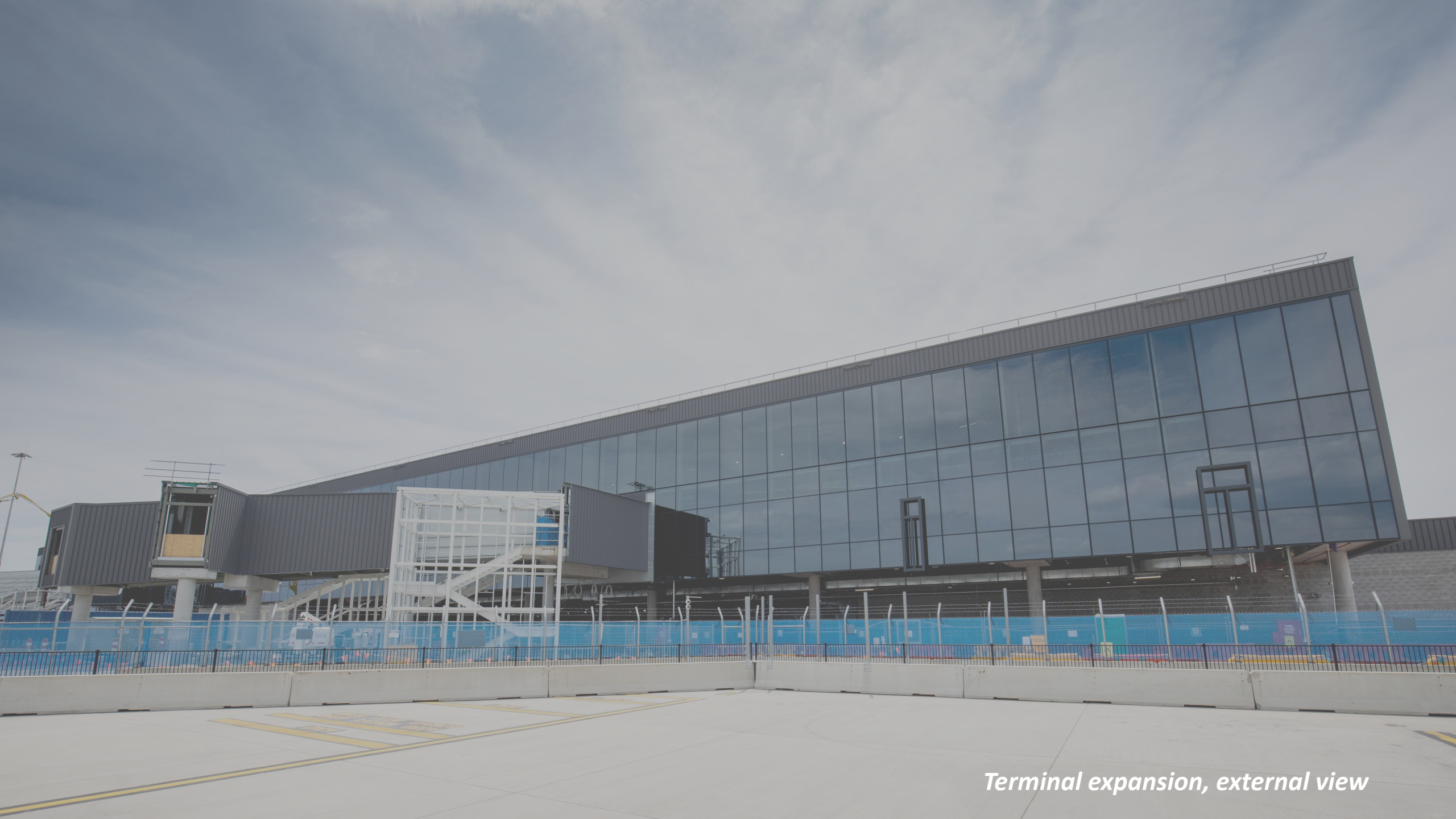
- Gold Coast-Singapore – 14 February
- Gold Coast-Auckland – 2 March
- Gold Coast-Perth – 15 March
- Virgin Australia Gold Coast-Cairns – resuming March
- Virgin Australia Gold Coast-Hobart and Launceston – resuming June
- Gold Coast-Queenstown, Christchurch and Wellington – expected to resume mid-year



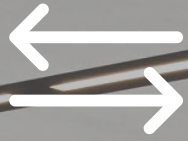
Gold Coast Airport terminal expansion

- Internal fit-out continues
- Aerobridges installed late 2021
- Opening for domestic and international services later this year

Airside Processing Zone

- Addition to existing terminal
- Connects to both north and south terminal areas
- New air-conditioned queuing zone
- Reduces congestion in departure lounge
- Practical completion in March

Master Plan

- In early stages of 2024 Master Plan
- Strategic document which guides airport development
- Involves extensive engagement with stakeholders, including community members
- Extension granted to allow COVID-19 recovery in operations, and also to integrate public transport planning
- Currently engaging with Queensland Government on light and heavy rail connections to airport
- Public consultation expected early 2024, final document due late 2024
